Introduction to DIY Floral Design

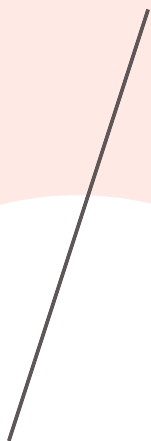

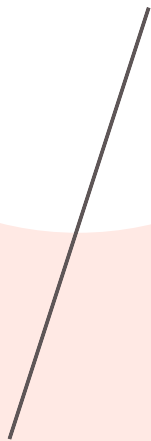

Nip your worries in the bud (literally!) with floral design. Studies have found that spending time cutting and

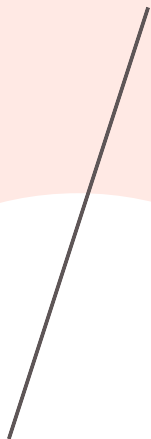
arranging flowers can have therapeutic benefits, giving an individual improved mental well-being.

5. Connect With an Ancient Art Form

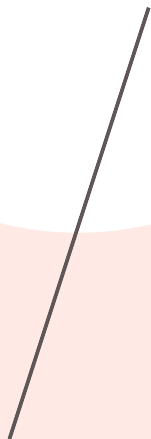

Essential Tools and Materials

- **Clean Clippers or Shears**

Having clean, sharp clippers or shears is key for cutting stems and trimming flowers how you want them to look. They can also be used to cut or curl any ribbon you may use when decorating.

- **Vase**

Choose a vase based on the desired size of your arrangement. It's a bonus if you already have one lying around the house!

- **Floral Foam**

Floral foam acts as a great base that even professional florists use in their arrangements. This handy base will allow you to arrange your flowers in a way you never thought possible!

- **Bouquet Ties, Wrap, and Tape**

Use these items to secure your flowers as you arrange them as professional florists do. You can also use stylish tape and ties to decorate the outside of the arrangement and vase.

- **Water & Watering Can**

To keep your flowers looking fresh, make sure to keep a full watering can nearby. Tap water around 50-60 degrees Fahrenheit is ideal.

- **Flowers & More Flowers**

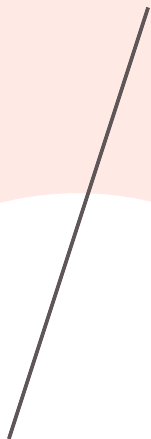
The most essential material for flower arranging is the flowers, of course! When picking out your flowers, make sure to choose a variety of flowers. Find some greenery you can use as a base, and other flowers you may want to use as the focal point of the arrangement.

You can use flowers from your backyard or purchase some from a florist—just make sure you don't start trimming your neighbor's flowers without permission!

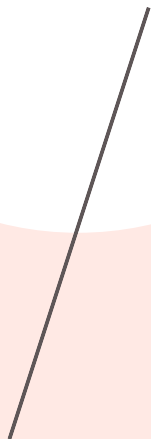

5. Visit Your Local Florist

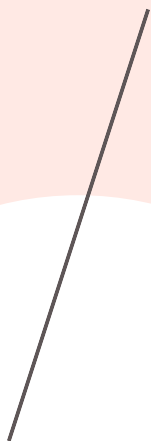

6. Join a Floral Arranging Club, Class, or Workshop

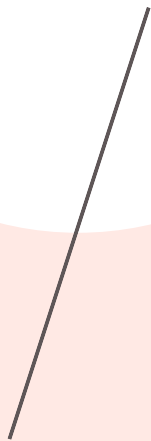

A Beginner's Step-By-Step Guide to Floral Arrangement



So, you've gathered your tools and you're ready to start designing your floral arrangement. Follow these eight simple steps to start creating your very own floral design:

Step 1: Get Inspired

The first step is to get inspired. As we talked about in the previous chapter, there are several different ways you can find inspiration: walk around your neighborhood, jump online for inspirational images, or even join a workshop or club to get the creative juices flowing.

Step 2: Decide on a Color Scheme

It's important to be mindful of the colors that you choose for your arrangement's color scheme. Colors have been directly linked to prompting specific emotions: bright reds can encourage energy and happiness, while greens or blues are more soothing and relaxing.

If you're arranging the flowers for a party, then you might want to consider color psychology and go with something that elicits energy and joy. Or if you're arranging flowers to put in a vase on your nightstand, you may want to go with cooler colors that promote calmness and tranquility.

The beauty of flower arrangement is that there are no set

rules you have to follow, so use colors that you want—with DIY floral arrangement, you're in complete control!

Step 3: Find Your Flowers

The next step is to find flowers for your arrangement. With your color scheme in mind, you most likely have some specific flowers you're going to want to incorporate into your bouquet.

If not, do some online research, then visit your local florist shop or use flowers already blooming in your backyard to start creating.

When gathering flowers, make sure to grab these different types:

Greenery → for the base

Focal flower → the flower you'll center the arrangement around

Secondary flowers → the flowers that will compliment the focal flower

Filler flowers → the flowers that fill gaps and add texture

Step 4: Prepare the Flowers

Using your clean clippers or shears, cut each flower's stem at a 45-degree angle. This will help the flower be able to absorb more water once it's placed in the vase. Set all of the cut flowers to the side.

Step 5: Prepare the Vase

Choose a clean vase that will not only support your arrangement but will complement the bouquet's color

scheme and add to the cohesive look.

Before you can add the flowers to the vase, you'll need to add some mechanics to the vase. Take your bouquet foam or add tape to make a gridded design on the top of the vase. This will come in handy as you begin to place the flowers in the vase, helping them stay upright and in the structure that you want them to.

Step 6: Add Greenery as a Base

One of the best things you can do to make your bouquet stand out is add in a base. Using the greenery that you have, insert the stems down into the vase. The greenery base will add texture and depth to your arrangement, and let you fill in any empty areas. Think long wispy grass, shrubs, or even palms.

Step 7: Add Focal Flowers

Think of focal flowers as the main attraction of your arrangement. They will be where the viewers' eyes go first. It's okay to choose more than one focal flower, but less is more here.

Add the focal flowers to the vase, placing it between the greenery. Make sure to distribute the flowers throughout the vase and not just in one area.

Bonus tip: To give your arrangement a more natural look, choose an odd number of blooms for your focal flower, just like how you might find a bunch of them existing in nature.

Step 8: Add Secondary Flowers

If focal flowers are the star of the show, then secondary flowers are the supporting actors. But even supporting actors can win Oscars, so make sure to select flowers that will compliment your focal flowers' star quality.

Secondary flowers should seek to create depth in your arrangement and complement your color scheme. Try adding in flowers that range from buds to full bloom for extra texture and size variance.

Step 9: Add Filler Flowers

The last flower you should add is your filler flowers. These can be baby's breath, snapdragons, or any other smaller flower that adds texture to your arrangement and fills any gaps.

Make sure to take a step back and look at your bouquet from all sides. Are there any gaps? Add in some filler flowers. Are there too many focal flowers localized in one area? Spread them out. Now's the time for you to put on any finishing touches.

Step 10: Display Your Work!

Congratulations! You've officially created a floral arrangement. Take pride in your work and display your bouquet around your home, office, or any other space for you to enjoy. Part of the fun of floral arrangement is being

able to admire your work in the days after you complete a design.
